WHAT IS TRO?

Federal TRIO Programs (Talent Search, Upward Bound, Upward Bound Math/Science, Veterans' Upward Bound, Student Support Services, Educational Opportunity Centers, and the Ronald E. McNair Post-Baccalaureate Achievement Program) help students to overcome economic, social, academic, and cultural barriers to higher education.

WHO DO THE PROGRAMS SERVE?

TRIO students are mostly low-income and the first in their families to go to college. Nationwide, there are over 3,500 TRIO programs which serve nearly 857,000 low-income students ranging from 6^{th} grade through adult education.

WHY ARE THEY IMPORTANT?

Giving a helping hand to low-income students is both the right thing to do and in our national self-interest. Too many promising, even brilliant students grow up in low-income surroundings with little family wealth to help smooth their paths. Helping them is a significant investment; the United States needs students of every background who are academically prepared and motivated to achieve success to remain competitive with other nations.


